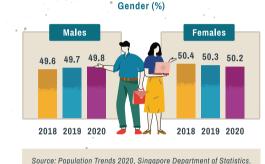

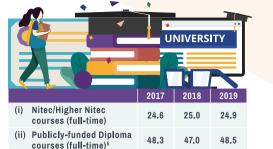

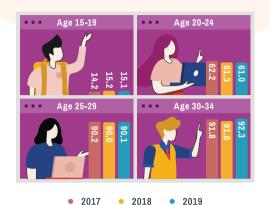

Age-Specific Resident Labour Force Participation Rates<sup>1</sup> as at June of the Year (%)



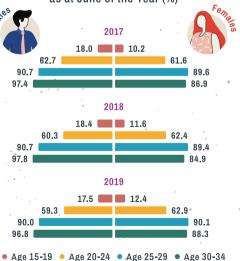

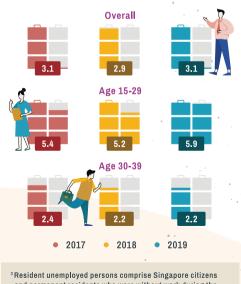

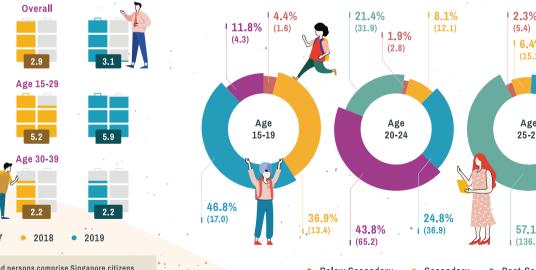

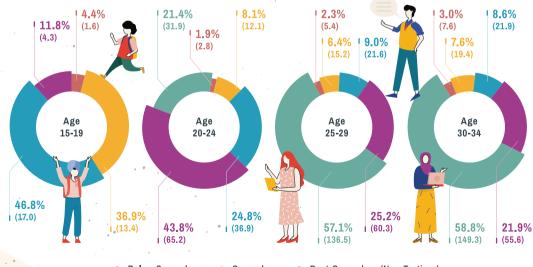

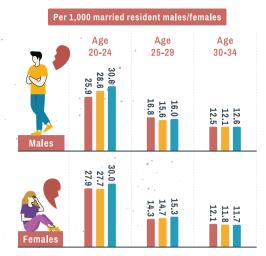

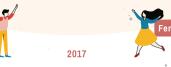

#### Prevalence of Probable Pathological Gambling by Age (%)

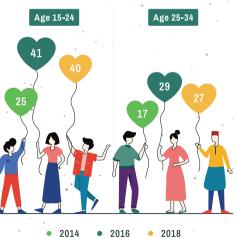
