












Proportion of Singles AMONG RESIDENT POPULATION BY GENDER AND AGE GROUP (%)


AGE-SPECIFIC Marriage Rates2

AGE-SPECIFIC Divorce Rates3



Median Age OF RESIDENT LIVE BIRTHS FOR First Time Mothers
















AGE-GENDER DISTRIBUTION OF STIS Incidence Rates (INCIDENCE RATE PER 100,000 POPULATIONS)




